## Rules:

1. Please submit a preliminary entry form with your choice of entries.
2. The Society reserves the right to amend the number of animals and/or the ratio.
3. The final entry date will be determined when entry fees will be payable
4. The entry fee is R1000 per animal. If you want to withdraw an animal, but the animal has already been entered and has received a lot number, you will still be liable for the R1000 per animal entry fee.
5. Males must on the day of the sale be between 36 and 96 months.
6. Females must on the day of the sale be between 24 and 72 months.
7. Females must be pregnant and calve within the prescribed calving period.
8. Animals will be screened on farm in accordance with a screening card.
9. Animals must score an average of 7 with not one point under 6.
10. Animals will again just prior to the sale be inspected and scored by independent inspectors
11. Animals with cull faults will be cancelled but those with a low score will merely be withdrawn from the sale.
12. The normal rules of Schedule G2 will be applied.
13. Animals must conform to the attached requirements and the performance of the parents of young bulls will be considered should such animals be entered. All bulls on sale must have their DNA recorded as well as the bulls running with the female animals on sale.
14. Entries and lot numbers will be determined by the coordinators.
15. Reserve prices will be determined by the seller and the auctioneer.
16. All records of animals to be presented for sale will be verified by the Society.
17. The buyer will be responsible for having the bulls retested for fertility.
18. As the Society would be acting in good faith, neither the seller nor the buyer will have any claim whatsoever against the Society in this regard.
19. Animals must all test negative for TB and CA, no longer than 90 days prior to the sale.
20. Bulls must all be fertility tested and must test negative for Fibroses and Trichomoniasis within 90 days prior to the date of the sale.
21. Animals that exceed production norms may not be sold at sales under the auspices of the Nguni Society.
22. No changes are allowed after the closing date for entries.
23. All animals must be free of ticks, external parasites and should be in a saleable condition.
24. At the conclusion of the Sale, any buyers who wish to privately sell animals which had been offered in the ring will be held liable for all commission as set out in the conditions of sale.
25. Good quality photo's must be submitted in time, preferably taken by a professional photographer.
