It is our aim that only animals of outstanding quality be presented and a maximum of 50 animals will be on sale.

Date: 9 November 2017

Time: 17:00

The sale will be followed by a get-together function and the Annual General Meeting will be presented on 10 November 2017.

Preliminary entries must reach the office prior to 15 April 2017; please confirm with the office that your entries had indeed been received.

Animals to be presented for sale must be screened on farm prior to 15 July 2017.

Rules:

1. Breeders are allowed to enter two animals, either of the same sex or one of each sex.
2. Animals must be at the sale venue prior to 17:00 on 8 November 2017.
3. Please submit a preliminary entry form with your choice of entries of which two will ultimately be selected. This will determine whether the number of animals and/or the ratio between male and female will be changed.
4. The Society reserves the right to amend the number of animals and/or the ratio.
5. The final entry date will be determined when entry fees will be payable
6. The entry fee is R2000 per animal of which R1000 will be reimbursed on arrival of your animals at the sale venue.
7. Males must on the day of the sale be between 36 and 96 months.
8. Females must on the day of the sale be between 24 and 72 months.
9. Females must be pregnant and calve within the prescribed calving period.
10. Animals will be screened on farm in accordance with a screening card.
11. Animals must score an average of 7 with not one point under 6.
12. Animals will again just prior to the sale be inspected and scored by independent inspectors
13. Animals with cull faults will be cancelled but those with a low score will merely be withdrawn from the sale.
14. The normal rules of Schedule G2 will be applied.
15. Animals must conform to the attached requirements and the performance of the parents of young bulls will be considered should such animals be entered.
16. Lot numbers will be allocated on a first come first serve basis as well as the drawing of lots.
17. Sellers are responsible for feeding their own animals.
18. Reserve prices will be determined by the seller and the auctioneer.
19. All records of animals to be presented for sale will be verified by the Society.
20. Should the new owner (buyer) within three weeks after the sale decide that the animal that he had acquired at the sale does not conform to breed standards and displays visible and clear culling faults the buyer must without delay advise the seller\breeder of the relevant animal as well as the Society.
21. It is then the responsibility of the seller to replace such animal should culling faults indeed be present or to reimburse the buyer for the selling price minus sale commission. The seller must however first return the relevant animal to the seller in the same condition in which it was on the date of sale. The buyer will not have any claim against the seller in respect of any resultant damage and after three weeks the buyer will have no claim.
22. The buyer will be responsible for having the bulls retested for fertility.
23. As the Society would be acting in good faith, neither the seller nor the buyer will have any claim whatsoever against the Society in this regard.
24. Animals must all test negative for TB and CA, no longer than 90 days prior to the sale.
25. Bulls must all be fertility tested and must test negative for Fibroses and Trichomoniasis within 90 days prior to the date of the sale.
26. Animals that exceed production norms may not be sold at sales under the auspices of the Nguni Society.
27. No changes are allowed after the closing date for entries.
28. All animals must be free of ticks, external parasites and should be in a saleable condition.
29. At the conclusion of the Sale, any buyers who wish to privately sell animals which had been offered in the ring will be held liable for all commission as set out in the conditions of sale.
